



SRR Elite Cheerleading Class Behaviour Policy

At SRR Elite Cheerleading, we are dedicated to providing a safe, inclusive, and enjoyable environment for all participants. To ensure a positive experience for everyone, we have established the following behaviour guidelines for all of our members:

1.Age and Ability:

Our classes are designed for children ages 3 years and above who can follow basic instructions to ensure safety. Children not yet able to meet this requirement may be asked to participate in sessions where parents are allowed to join them.

2.Coach's Instructions:

Children must follow their coach's instructions at all times to maintain a safe and productive learning environment. It is essential that children do not attempt skills beyond their capability unless supported by a coach. If a coach asks them to stop, they must do so immediately.

3.Respect for Coaches:

Children are expected to treat their coaches with respect and courtesy at all times. Our staff are there to help and support the children to become the best athletes they can be; therefore we do not tolerate any rudeness, abusive behaviour towards our staff.

4.Respect for other children in the class:

At SRR Elite Cheerleading we want to provide a positive and fun environment for all our athletes, therefore all our members must treat all other members with respect. We do not tolerate any form of unkindness towards teammates. At SRR Elite Cheerleading we take any bullying allegations very seriously. Coaches will follow our incident reporting procedure for any incidents that occur, this may include meetings being held with parents. We do not tolerate any form of bullying including cyber, SEND related bullying, Homophobic related bullying.



5. Core Values:

Our core values are: Believe in yourself, Work Hard, Inclusivity, Safety

Children are encouraged to embody these values in their actions and interactions during class.

6. Handling Disruptive Behaviour:

In the event of disruptive behaviour, our coaches will follow a progressive approach:

- > Verbal warning: The coach will address the issue with the child and remind them of our behaviour expectations.
- > Time-out: If the disruptive behaviour continues, the child may be given a brief time-out to reflect on their actions.
- > Parental involvement: If disruptive behaviour persists, the parent/guardian may be asked to observe the class or participate with their child.
- > Removal from class: In cases of ongoing disruption that jeopardise the safety or experience of other participants, the child may be removed from the class. We will make every effort to find a suitable alternative class if necessary.

7. Safety First:

The safety of all participants is our top priority. If we believe that a child's needs are better suited for an alternative class or program, we reserve the right to make this decision in the interest of safety. We are committed to fostering a positive and supportive atmosphere where children can develop their cheerleading skills and values. Our goal is to create an environment where every child can thrive and enjoy their cheerleading journey.
